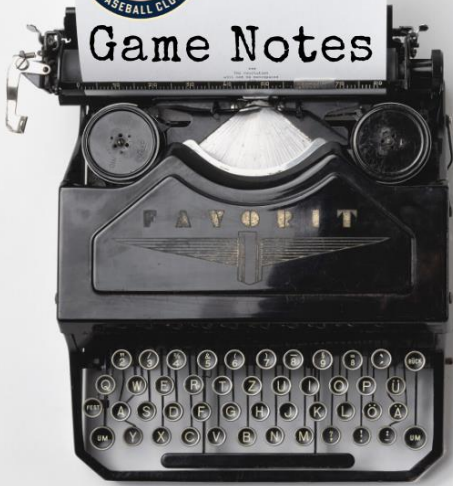

MONARCHS HEADLINES

LAST NIGHT: The Monarchs broke open a 1-1 game in the fourth inning and never looked back in a 12-5 win. Ryan Grotjohn gave the Monarchs the early lead then a three-run blast from Casey Gillaspie gave “kay-see” 4-1 lead. Jacob Robson added a two RBI double an inning later and it was 6-1. The Goldeyes would answer with three in the bottom of the fifth, but the Monarchs came back with four in the sixth powered by a pair of doubles from Mallex Smith and Kevin Santa to make it 10-4 and added two more in the seventh.

TODAY: The Monarchs (60-34, 2nd in the West) play the Winnipeg Goldeyes (50-44, 3rd place in the West) in game two of a three game series.

PITCHING MATCHUP: The Monarchs will send LHP Matt Hall (9-2, 1.18) to the hill to face RHP Freisis Adames (7-3, 5.40) for the Goldeyes.

UP NEXT: The Monarchs will head home and spend half of the “off day” on the bus before beginning a four-game series against the Fargo-Moorhead RedHawks at Legends Field in Kansas City.

THE ROAD AHEAD: The Monarchs have 7 games left with 4 at Legends Field and the other 3 on the road. The rest of the division contenders’ home and away with the Magic number to win the division sitting at 7 for Fargo-Moorhead.

MONARCHS EXTRAS

VS. WINNIPEG: This is the fourth series meeting between the two clubs with the Monarchs leading the season series at 8-2. Last season the Goldeyes played a majority of their season in Jackson, Tennessee, and the year prior they were based in Fargo, North Dakota. The Goldeyes are finally playing their first full season at their home Shaw Park since 2019 in 2022. In the American Association the Monarchs are 33-34 against Winnipeg and all time with the meetings in the Northern League the franchise is 72-87.

THE BIG 60: The Monarchs win last night gave the club 60 wins. It is the third time the franchise has won at least 60 in a season. The team did it in 2021 (69-31), 2018 (62-37) and this season.

GOING YARD: The Monarchs lead the American Association in home runs with 159 home runs and for the second season in a row broke the single season American Association mark of 147. The next record is the franchise record of 162 set in 2010 in the Northern League. Currently the Monarchs are averaging 1.69 home runs per game with a current pace of 169. The Monarchs have gone yard in 73 of 94 games (78% of the games played) and have hit two or more home runs in a game 39 times.

TOPS IN LONG BALLS AND STRIKEOUTS: The Monarchs lead the league in home runs (159) and strikeouts as a pitching staff (907). If the Monarchs maintain that lead, they will be the fourth team in league history to achieve that status. The other three teams were the 2013 Wichita Wingnuts (107 HR/782 SO), 2016 Fargo-Moorhead RedHawks (121 HR/838 SO) and the 2019 Chicago Dogs (122 HR/895 SO).

POST SEASON BOUND: The win last Saturday night punched the Monarchs fourth straight post season ticket and ninth as a franchise. KC sat out the 2020 season due to the pandemic but made the post season as a wild card in 2018, a division champion in 2019 and 2021 and at the moment trail first place Fargo-Moorhead by 4.5 games with the teams having four games head-to-head Labor Day weekend. The Monarchs fourth straight playoff berth sets a new franchise record and breaks a tie with the 2008-2010 T-Bones who made it three straight years. The club was managed in 2008 and 2009 by Andy McCauley and 2010 by Tim Doherty.

RUNAWAY: The Monarchs have score 660 runs this season and could break their own franchise and American Association mark of 667 runs set last season. The team needs 8 runs between now and the final out on Labor Day or average 1.3 runs per game to break that mark.

LEAGUE LEADERS: The Monarchs lead the American Association at the plate hitting .294. The team also leads runs scored (660), home runs (159), OBP (.383) and OPS (.893). While the Monarchs are known for the long ball, they are second in triples with 22. The team has 371 extra base hits so far this season. On the hill the club has the second lowest ERA at 4.48 and tops in strike outs (907) and a WHIP (1.38).

MONARCHS FLASHBACK: On August 30, 1946, the Monarchs split a doubleheader with the Indianapolis Clowns at Sportsman's Park in St. Louis. The Clowns squeezed out the first game 3-2 but in game two the crowd grew to 16,500 as Satchel Paige took the hill for Kansas City. Paige threw just 25 pitches to get the first nine batters in the game before he would "ease along in his easy fashion". The Monarchs would win 6-1 in game two with Willard Brown and Johnie Scott each getting three hits while Herb Souell and Mickey Taborn each had two hits in the win for the Monarchs.

REIGN REBORN: The old Kansas City T-Bones franchise was sold to Mark Brandmeyer following the 2019 season. With the 2020 season postponed the ownership took the opportunity to rebrand the ball club. On January 21, 2021 #reignreborn returned with the announcement from the Negro Leagues Museum President, Bob Kendrick, that a partnership had come together with the Kansas City T-Bones for the team to be known going forward as the “Kansas City Monarchs Baseball Club.” The long-anticipated name change and terms of the agreement were revealed in a press conference at the museum with Kendrick, T-Bones owner, Mark Brandmeyer, NLBM Board members and city officials all in attendance. The team that took the field in the former T-Bone’s stadium in 2021, now known as Legends Field are now known as the Kansas City Monarchs. 8/16

ABOUT THE MUSUEM: Established in a one-room office in 1990, the Negro Leagues Baseball Museum (NLBM) is a privately funded, not-for-profit organization dedicated to preserving and celebrating the rich history of African-American baseball and its profound impact on the social advancement of America. In 2006, the United States Congress designated the NLBM as “America’s National Negro Leagues Baseball Museum.”

Where History Touches Home-The Negro Leagues Baseball Museum (NLBM) is the world’s only museum dedicated to preserving and celebrating the rich history of African-American baseball and its impact on the social advancement of America. The privately funded, 501 c3, not-for-profit is located in the heart of Kansas City, Missouri’s Historic 18th & Vine Jazz District. The NLBM operates two blocks from the Paseo YMCA where Andrew “Rube” Foster established the Negro National League in 1920. The NLBM opened its doors to the public in a tiny, one-room office space in 1991 with a dream of building a permanent facility that would pay rightful tribute to America’s unsung baseball heroes. In November of 1997, under the leadership of its late chairman John “Buck” O’Neil, that dream became a reality when the NLBM moved into its new 10,000 square-foot home inside a cultural complex known as the Museums at 18th & Vine. Since that time, the NLBM has welcomed more than 2-million visitors and has become one of the most important cultural institutions in the world for its work to give voice to a once forgotten chapter of baseball and American history.

MONARCHS HISTORY: Kansas City Monarchs Owned by J.L. Wilkinson, a white businessman, the Monarchs were one of the best known and most successful black teams. The Monarchs captured a total of ten pennants, tying the Homestead Grays for the most flags by any Negro League team, and suffered only one losing season during their entire association with the Negro Leagues. And that season was during World War II, when the roster was decimated by the loss of players to military service. The Monarchs also hold the distinction of having won the first World Series ever played between opposing leagues, both in the initial World Series in 1924 between the Negro National League and the Eastern Colored League, and again in the reinstated World Series in 1942 between the Negro National League and the Negro American League.

A charter member of the Negro National League, they played through the 1930 season, winning pennants in 1923-1925 and 1929 while never experiencing a losing season. They narrowly missed a fourth straight pennant in 1926, when they won the first half title but lost a bitter nine game playoff to the Chicago American Giants by dropping a doubleheader on the last day. The Monarchs played in the first two World Series ever played, facing the Hilldale team on both occasions.

After dropping out of the league they played independent ball until joining the Negro American League as a charter member in 1937 and remaining even after the league lost its major status. During the first six seasons (1937-1942) they won five pennants, missing only in 1938. After the return of many of their best players, who had been called to service during World War II, they annexed another flag in 1946. In 1942, the first World Series since 1927 was played between the Monarchs and the Homestead Grays, with the Monarchs sweeping the Grays in four straight games. In 1946 the Monarchs lost a tough seven game Series to the Newark Eagles.

In 1948 the Monarchs won the second half of the split season but lost a seven game play off to the Birmingham Black Barons for the pennant and thereby missed a chance to appear in the last Negro World Series ever played. Following that World Series, the Negro National League folded and the Negro American League absorbed some of the franchises and expanded into division play. The Monarchs won the first half title in 1949 and annexed a division title in 1950. Wilkinson had sold the franchise after the 1948 season to Tom Baird, who continued to operate the Monarchs through the 1950s, but by then the league was strictly a minor league operation.

EXTRA EXTRA: The Monarchs have 371 extra base hits this season passing last years total of 360 hit by the club. It is the first time the Monarchs have had back-to-back 300 plus extra base hit seasons since 2010 and 2011. The 371 is a franchise high.

FIVE IN A ROW: Under the direction of Joe Calfapietra, the team has finished above .500 four straight seasons and will once again hit that mark this season with the record currently 60-34. The franchise has never been above back-to-back seasons in either city prior to his arrival of .500 seasons. The T-Bones did reach the post season three straight seasons from 2008-2010 but only in 2010 did the team finish above .500.

MONARCHS IN CANADA: The Monarchs and the Satchel Paige led integrated Bismarck; North Dakota Club played a legendary game on June 6, 1935. The game was played at Winnipeg’s Osborne Stadium which had reopened after renovations with an exhibition that featured future Hall of Famers Willard Brown, Satchel Paige, and Bullet Rogan. The game ended in a scoreless tie. The Monarchs, an independent team in 1935, were considered the home team for the exhibition, while the integrated professional team from Bismarck, North Dakota, was considered the road team. The exhibition produced a classic pitching duel between two of the Negro Leagues greatest stars -- Satchel Paige and Chet Brewer. Neither gave up a run in the 0-0 tie. Paige fanned 17, Brewer struck out 13 in the historic matchup.

FRANCHISE MILESTONES:

- Jan Hernandez has a .443 OBP currently would be third highest in a single season in franchise history just behind Ryan Cavan who had a .447 OBP in 2015 and Anthony Lewis .444 in 2000 in Duluth. His 1.128 OPS is the highest in franchise history currently.
- Darnell Sweeney stole two bases last Wednesday night and now sits alone in second place in franchise history with 58. He trails Aharon Eggleston who had 86 from 2007-2009 and 2011.
- Casey Gillaspie has 135 extra base hits and is now fifth. He is now 5th in home runs with 51. His 81 doubles ties him for the fifth spot with Ray Sadler (2010-2014). He is now 2nd in walks at 165 for his KC career trailing only Jim Fason who had 182 from 2008-2011.
- Matt Adams hit 27 home runs this season good for 4th all-time single season in franchise history. Adams became just the sixth player in the franchise to hit at least 85 RBI in a season.
- Jameson McGrane with 26 save is fifth in franchise history. The record is 33 held by Cody Winiarski and Carlos Diaz.
- Matt Hall 1.18 ERA currently is the single season tops in the franchise history.
- 60 wins this season is third highest single season in franchise history and third time the franchise has won at least 60.
- After a slow start to the month the Monarchs are one win away from 16 wins in a month. It would be their 13 time in franchise history with at least 16 wins in a month. 10 of those months would have come with Joe Calfapietra as manager.

HALL ON A ROLL: Matt Hall is closing in on the single season ERA crown with the franchise. His 1.18 ERA currently ranks first all time in franchise history with a minimum of 76 innings. He would need to finish below 2.59 that Lucas Irvine in 2012 and Jon McDonald posted in 2005.

RECORD K'S TIED: The Monarchs pushed their season total strikeouts to 907 last night setting a new franchise mark and the first time the club has crossed the 900 mark. The Monarch's pitching staff has reached the 800 strike out mark in each of the last five seasons the team has played including a then franchise high 897 in 2017. The franchise had never hit more than 653 which is the high set in 2004. The league mark is 943 set last season by Chicago. The Monarchs need 37 strikeouts or average 6.1 K's per game over the last six games to pass that mark.

SUMMER OF CELEBRATION: On July 24th while the Monarchs were in Fargo completing a dramatic comeback, the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, New York inducted the late Buck O'Neil into "the hall". The other names added along with Buck were Baseball Writers' Association of America electee David Ortiz, Golden Days Era Committee electees Gil Hodges, Jim Kaat, Minnie Miñoso and Tony Oliva and Early Baseball Era Committee electees Bud Fowler and O'Neil.

ABOUT BUCK: Born on Nov. 13, 1911, in Carrabelle, Fla., O'Neil began his baseball career barnstorming before signing with the Memphis Red Sox in 1937. The following year, O'Neil had his contract sold to the Kansas City Monarchs, the team with which he would spend the rest of his playing career (with a two-year interruption for naval service in World War II). He was a player, a manager, the first Black coach in AL/NL history, a scout and one of the game's leading advocates – helping shed light on the importance of Negro Leagues history. Primarily a first baseman, O'Neil was known for his smooth glove work more than his bat, although he was a capable hitter as well; per the Negro Leagues Baseball Museum, his .353 average in 1946 -- the year after he returned from his military service -- made him that season's Negro American League batting champion. As a member of the Monarchs, O'Neil was a three-time All-Star and became a Negro World Series champion in 1942.

POST SEASON 2022: The American Association implemented a new playoff format for this season. The top four teams from each division will make the post season, with three rounds to determine the winner of the Miles Wolff Cup. The regular season East and West Division champions will pick their first round Division Playoff Series opponent among the other three playoff teams in their division. The post-season will begin with four Division Playoff Series on Wednesday, September 7. The best-of-three format will see the lower seed host Game 1. Games 2 and 3 (if necessary) will shift to the home ballpark of the higher seed on September 9 & 10. Following a travel day, the East and West Division Championship Series get started on Monday, September 12. This round is also a best-of-three format with the lower seed hosting Game 1, with Games 2 and 3 (if necessary) again moving to the home ballpark of the higher seed. Those games will be played on September 14 & 15. The Miles Wolff Cup Finals open on Saturday, September 17 at the home of the lower seed. Game 2 of the best-of-five series will take place Sunday, September 18. The Wolff Cup Finals shift to the stadium of the higher seed for Games 3, 4 (if necessary) and 5 (if necessary) on September 20-22.

ON THE AIR: Dan Vaughan returns for his sixth season as the broadcaster for Kansas City's independent baseball team. This is his second as the "voice of the Monarchs" after holding the "Voice of the T-Bones" role from 2017-2020. Prior to coming to the metro Vaughan spent the previous four years with the Gary SouthShore RailCats in the American Association and in the Australian summer he is one of the voices of the Perth Heat of the Australian Baseball League during the USA winters. Since the rebrand of the Monarchs Vaughan has dived headfirst into the exciting content that the Negro Leagues Baseball Museum offers and the fantastic history of the Monarchs. Vaughan has two nightly pregame show features one called "*Monarchs 101 with DV*" and other "*The Coors Light Flashback Moment*" to look at the unique Monarchs baseball history during the broadcast. He can also be seen Monday through Friday in game days on "*Monarchs Mocha*" on Facebook and YouTube Live. The show is a look back at the game before and a preview of that night's game. He also will anchor a short Facebook and YouTube Live show on most nights home and away called *Monarchs Live*. The interactive radio broadcast can be heard on monarchsbaseball.com on the [Monarchs Mixlr](#) channel and the MixLR app. The pregame begins at 6:30 with Monarchs 101 with DV and "The Top Step with Manager Joe Calfapietra.

Lee's Summit, Missouri native and former Missouri State University lefty Matt Hall returns to the Monarchs in 2021 after inking with Kansas City on April 15, 2022. In 2021, Hall appeared in five games, making four starts. Hall posted a 2.25 ERA while allowing just 18 hits and struck out 28 batters. He finished the 2021 season with a perfect 4-0 record. Hall was a late season free agent signee by Monarchs skipper Joe Calapietra and went right into the rotation to help the Monarchs run away with the South Division of the American Association and sweep their way to the league pennant. Hall was signed on August 21, 2021, and worked one inning of scoreless relief on the 24th at Kane County. From there Hall went into the rotation and won all four of his starts including two in the regular season and two in the postseason. Hall made his debut for the monarchs on August 24th where he pitched one inning with no hits, no runs, and one walk. On August 28th he held Houston scoreless for five innings while striking out seven to get his first win as a Monarch. He followed that with a quality start going six at Cleburne getting the win, holding the Railroaders to three hits and one earned run while punching out 10. That win was part of a four-game sweep of Cleburne down in Texas.

In the postseason Hall took the bump in the playoff opener in the Division series going six against Sioux City at Legends Field on September 10th. He would limit the Xs to six hits and one earned run while striking out four in a 11-2 KC win. He would then get the nod on September 17th in the league championship series striking out seven and getting the win in an 8-4 Monarchs win to take the series lead. He would surrender four runs on seven hits as the Monarchs won at Newman Outdoor Field.

The Monarchs signed LHP Matt Hall on August 22nd from the Boston Red Sox organization. Hall, 28, pitched in 25 major league games and made one start for the Detroit Tigers and Boston Red Sox. The lefty logged a 11.48 ERA in 40 innings with 41 strikeouts.

Hall last pitched for Triple-A Worcester in Boston's organization. He was 2-2 with a 7.36 ERA in 28 games. The left-hander also notched a save. Hall did not play the 2020 season.

In 2019, Hall appeared in 25 games at the AAA level. He finished the season with a 5-4 record with a 5.40 ERA over 86.2 innings tossed. Hall allowed 102 hits and 51 earned runs in that season.

The 2018 season for Hall was spent with two different teams, the Erie Seawolves (Erie, PA), and the Toledo Mud Hens (Toledo, OH). Hall made a smooth transition into AAA ball by going 4-0 on the mound while in Toledo. He finished the season with 135 strikeouts to just 45 walks.

Hall made a jump from A to AA in the 2017 season. He earned it by recording seven wins on the mound for Detroit's A affiliate, the Lakeland Flying Tigers. Hall received the call up to AA ball on August 4th, 2017 to join the Erie SeaWolves. Hall finished the season with 149 strikeouts. In 2016, Hall collected 11 wins on the bump, the most he's had in a single season. In 24 appearances Hall allowed just 36 earned runs in over 125
